


Ida Lewis (1842-1911) was the daughter of a lighthouse keeper, and herself a lighthouse keeper as well. She was well known for saving lives - one report says as many as 25 - over the course of her career - and she became the best known (and highest-paid) lighthouse keeper of her day. The Ida Lewis Yacht Club in Newport is named in her honor.






This copy inscribed to "D. L. Brainard from the author July 59." OCLC notes "Rembrandt Peale painted over 600 works of art throughout his lifetime. He painted many prominent individuals in American history, including George Washington, Thomas Jefferson and John C. Calhoun. This book was written by Peale and contains his personal memoirs along with his artistic philosophy."

Jaggard, p. 505 notes this edition was originally issued in 76 parts, and that there were some sets on fine paper, and others on large paper with proof plates.





The first edition appeared at Cork in 1835. Bigmore & Wyman, *Bibliography of Printing*, p. 77: "It is curious to see a bookseller adopt the absurd plan of noting the contents of the second half of his book by a fresh title ... It is an extremely curious and amusing work, and deserves more attention than it has received."
